WHY

Important uses of personal identifiers

For researchers

- Ensures that you are correctly **identified**
- Connects your **works, affiliations** and **awards**
- Increases your work's **visibility**
- It is open, **international**, community-based, and multidisciplinary

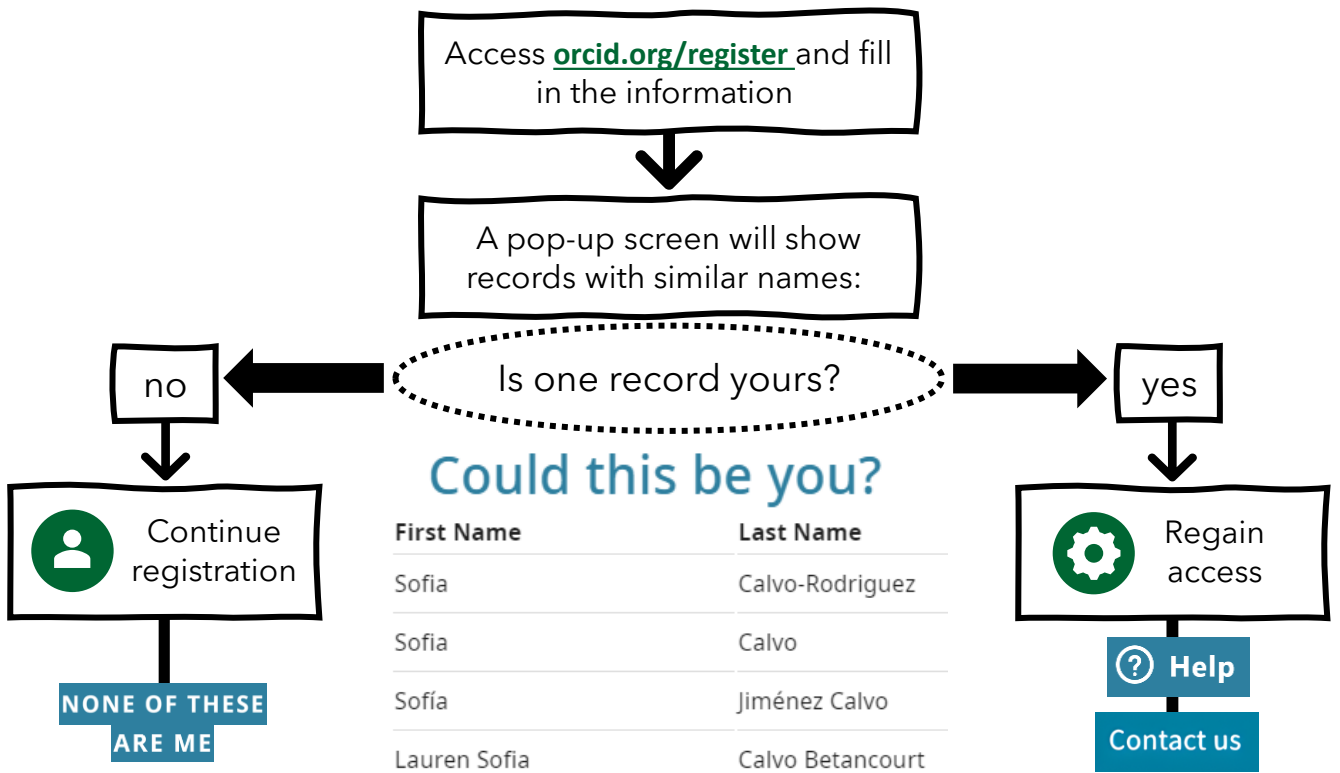


For institutions

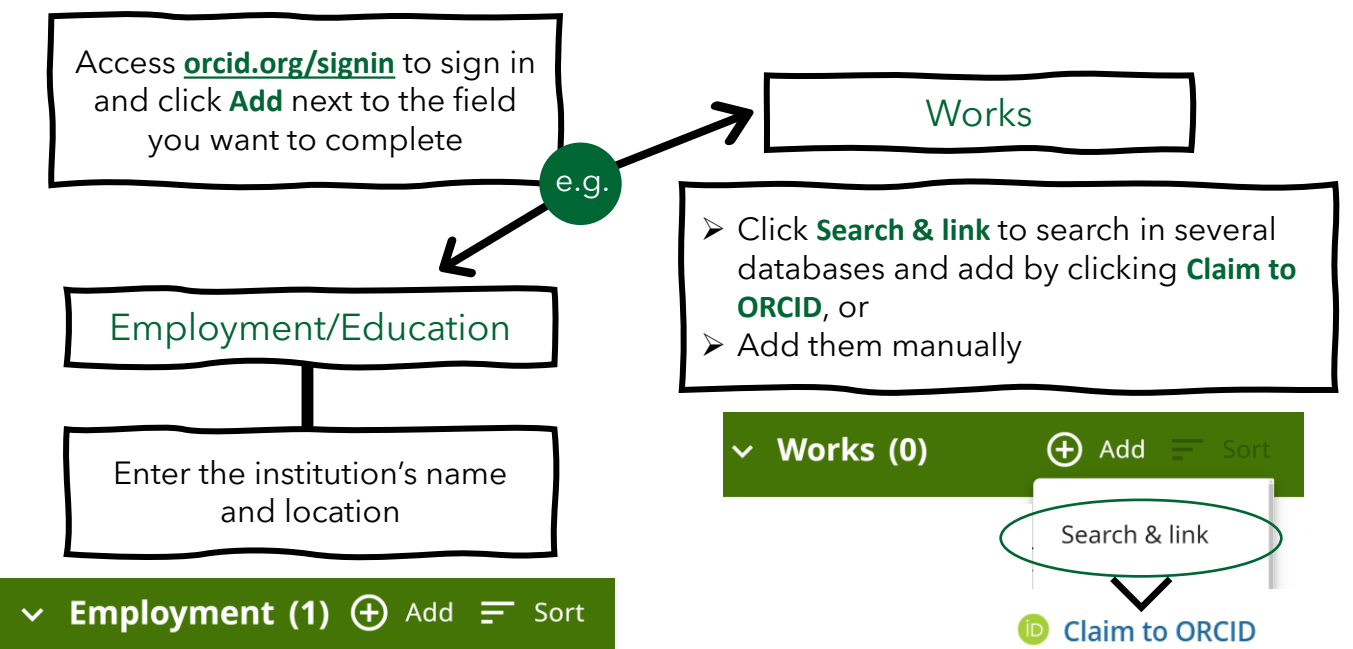
- Keeps better track** of researchers' careers
- Enables to **stay up to date** with researchers' outputs
- It enables compliance with **Open Science mandates**

- In your **researcher profiles** (e.g. Scopus ID)
- Applying for a **grant**
- In your **webpage**
- Submitting a **manuscript**
